ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

ISSUED BY: London Borough of Havering (herein after referred to as "the Council")

1. **THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE** which is issued by the Council because it appears to the Council that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171A(1)(a) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this Notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations.

2. THE LAND AFFECTED

The land known as **Edge Gym. Units H & I 23 Danes Road, Romford**, **RM7 0HL**, shown edged in black on the attached plan, and is registered under Land Registry Title Number EGL387926.

3. THE BREACHES OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED

Without planning permission, the material change of use from class (B1) Offices to use as a Private Fitness Gym.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

- (1) It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last ten years and that steps should be taken to remedy the breach by Section 173 4(a) or to remedy any injury to amenity which has been caused by the breach.
- (2) The change of use from offices (Class B1) offices to private fitness gym, is unacceptable in principle and results in the loss of a B1 use, which is harmful to the Secondary Employment Area contrary to Policy DC10 of the London Borough of Havering Local Development Framework Core Strategy and Development Control Policies Development Plan Document 2008.
- (3) The Council does not consider that planning permission should be granted because conditions attached to any consent would not overcome these problems and because the change of use has already been formally assessed as unacceptable under application P0245.18 and dismissed on appeal reference APP/B5480/W/19/3239600.

WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

The Enforcement Notices to require, within THREE MONTHS:

1. Cease the use of the land including units H & I as a gym;

AND

Within THREE MONTHS AND TWO WEEKS:

2. Remove all facilities associated with the gym from the premises.

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

3 MONTHS for step 1 and three months and two weeks for step 2 after the date when this Notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

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This Notice takes effect on **29**th **November 2021**, unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

THE RIGHT TO APPEAL

Those with a legal or equitable interest in the land or who is a relevant occupier can appeal against this Enforcement Notice to the Planning Inspectorate acting on behalf of the Secretary of State before **29**th **November 2021**. Further details are given in the attached explanatory note.

WHAT HAPPENS IF AN APPEAL IS NOT RECEIVED

If an appeal is not received against this Enforcement Notice, it will take effect on **29**th **November 2021** and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period specified in the Notice.

FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH AN ENFORCEMENT NOTICE WHICH HAS TAKEN EFFECT CAN RESULT IN PROSECUTION AND/OR REMEDIAL ACTION BY THE COUNCIL.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

THE RIGHT TO APPEAL

Any appeal must be in writing and received, or posted (with the postage paid and properly addressed) in time to be received in the ordinary course of the post, by the Planning Inspectorate before **29**th **November 2021.**

If an appeal against this Notice is intended, the instructions given on the information sheet from the Planning Inspectorate which accompanies this Notice should be followed.

GROUNDS OF APPEAL

The grounds of appeal are set out in Section 174 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) you may appeal on one or more of the following grounds:

- (a) that, in respect of any breach of planning control which may be constituted by the matters stated in the Notice, planning permission ought to be granted, as the case may be, the condition or limitation concerned ought to be discharged;
- (b) that those matters have not occurred:
- (c) that those matters (if they occurred) do not constitute a breach of planning control:
- (d) that, at the date when the notice was issued, no enforcement action could be taken in respect of any breach of planning control which may be constituted by those matters;
- (e) that copies of the Enforcement Notice were not served as required by section 172:
- (f) that steps required by the notice to be taken, or the activities required by the notice to cease, exceed what is necessary to remedy any breach of planning control which may be constituted by those matters or, as the case may be, to remedy any injury to amenity which has been caused by any such breach:
- (g) that any period specified in the notice in accordance with section 173(9) falls short of what should reasonably be allowed.

Not all these grounds may be relevant to you.

PLANNING APPLICATION FEE

Should you wish to appeal on ground (a) - that planning permission should be granted for the unauthorised development or use, then a fee of £924 is payable to the Council when

the appeal is lodged. If this fee is not paid, the planning merits of the appeal will not be considered by the Planning Inspector.


STATEMENT ON GROUNDS OF APPEAL
