

We recommend you carry out the following process in order to have a greater understanding

Once you have carried out your own market research (the Childcare Sufficiency Report can be found: www.havering.gov.uk/csr) and you decide to go ahead with setting up childcare provision.

Decide on the age range of children you wish to work with, how many hours and days per week you plan to be open and whether this is limited to term time or all year round:

(This process can be carried out more than once).



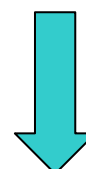
Quality Assurance Team Education Officers review the Initial Questionnaire for Prospective PVI Childcare Providers. The prospective PVI Childcare Provider receives a written response informing them of the outcome of their initial questionnaire.

(Should no contact be made by the prospective provider to the Local Authority (LA) within 3 months of the last request of information, the prospective provider will be removed from the database. All future applications will result in the prospective provider having to start the registration process from the beginning).



Sufficient information has been provided

The Prospective Provider is informed that they have provided sufficient information to the Local Authority (LA).
