#### **ENFORCEMENT NOTICE**

#### **ISSUED BY:** London Borough of Havering

1. **THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE** which is issued by the Council because it appears to the Council that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171A(1)(a) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this Notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations.

#### 2. THE LAND AFFECTED

The land at 177 St Mary's Lane Upminster RM14 3BL shown edged in black on the attached plan.

# 3. THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL ALLEGED

Without planning permission, the erection of a ground floor rear extension

# 4. **REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE**

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years and that steps should be taken to remedy the breach by Section 173 4(a) or to remedy any amenity or injury which has been caused by the breach.

The ground floor rear extension in question was substantially completed less than four years ago. The extension appears as an incongruous addition to the rear of the property. It is contrary to development plan policies and harmful to the visual amenities of the area.

In making its decision to issue this Notice the Council considered that the unauthorised use is contrary to the following policies of the Local Development Framework: Policy DC61; London Plan Policies 7.4 and 7.6 and the guidance within the National Planning Policy Framework.

The Council does not consider that planning permission should be given, because planning conditions could not overcome these problems.

# 5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

(i) Remove or demolish the unauthorised ground floor rear extension

Time for compliance: 1 month from the effective date of this notice.

And

(ii) Remove all waste materials associated with compliance in 1 above and restore the land to its condition prior to the construction

Time for compliance: 1 month from the effective date of this notice

# 6. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This Notice takes effect on 14<sup>th</sup> September 2018, unless an appeal is made against it beforehand

# EXPLANATORY NOTES

#### STATUTORY PROVISIONS

A summary of Sections 171A, 171B and 172 to 177 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) is enclosed with this Notice.

#### YOUR RIGHT OF APPEAL

You can appeal against this Notice, but any appeal must be in writing and received, or posted (with the postage paid and properly addressed) in time to be received in the ordinary course of the post, by the Secretary of State before 14<sup>th</sup> September 2018.

If you intend to appeal against this Notice you should follow the instructions given on the information sheet from the Planning Inspectorate which accompanies this Notice.

#### **GROUNDS OF APPEAL**

The grounds of appeal are set out in Section 174 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) you may appeal on one or more of the following grounds:-

- (a) that, in respect of any breach of planning control which may be constituted by the matters stated in the Notice, planning permission ought to be granted, as the case may be, the condition or limitation concerned ought to be discharged;
- (b) that those matters have not occurred;
- (c) that those matters (if they occurred) do not constitute a breach of planning control;
- (d) that, at the date when the notice was issued, no enforcement action could be taken in respect of any breach of planning control which may be constituted by those matters;

- (e) that copies of the Enforcement Notice were not served as required by section 172;
- (f) that steps required by the notice to be taken, or the activities required by the notice to cease, exceed what is necessary to remedy any breach of planning control which may be constituted by those matters or, as the case may be, to remedy any injury to amenity which has been caused by any such breach;
- (g) that any period specified in the notice in accordance with section 173(9) falls short of what should reasonably be allowed.

Not all these grounds may be relevant to you.

# PLANNING APPLICATION FEE

Should wish to appeal on ground (a) - that planning permission should be granted for the unauthorised development - then a fee of  $\pounds 234$  is payable both to the Secretary of State and to the Council, making the total fees payable  $\pounds 468$ . If the fees are not paid then that ground of appeal will not be valid.


# STATEMENT ON GROUNDS OF APPEAL
