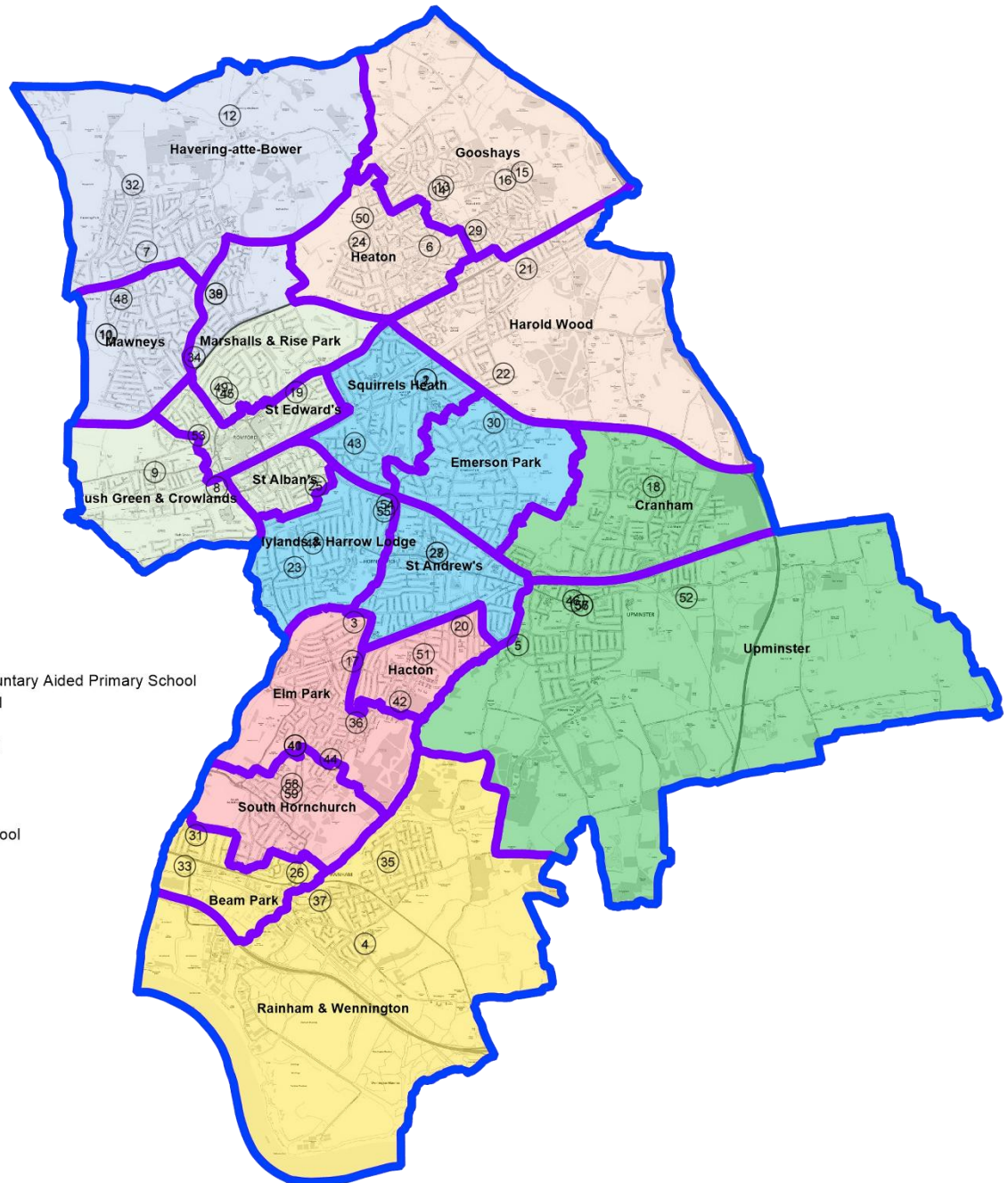

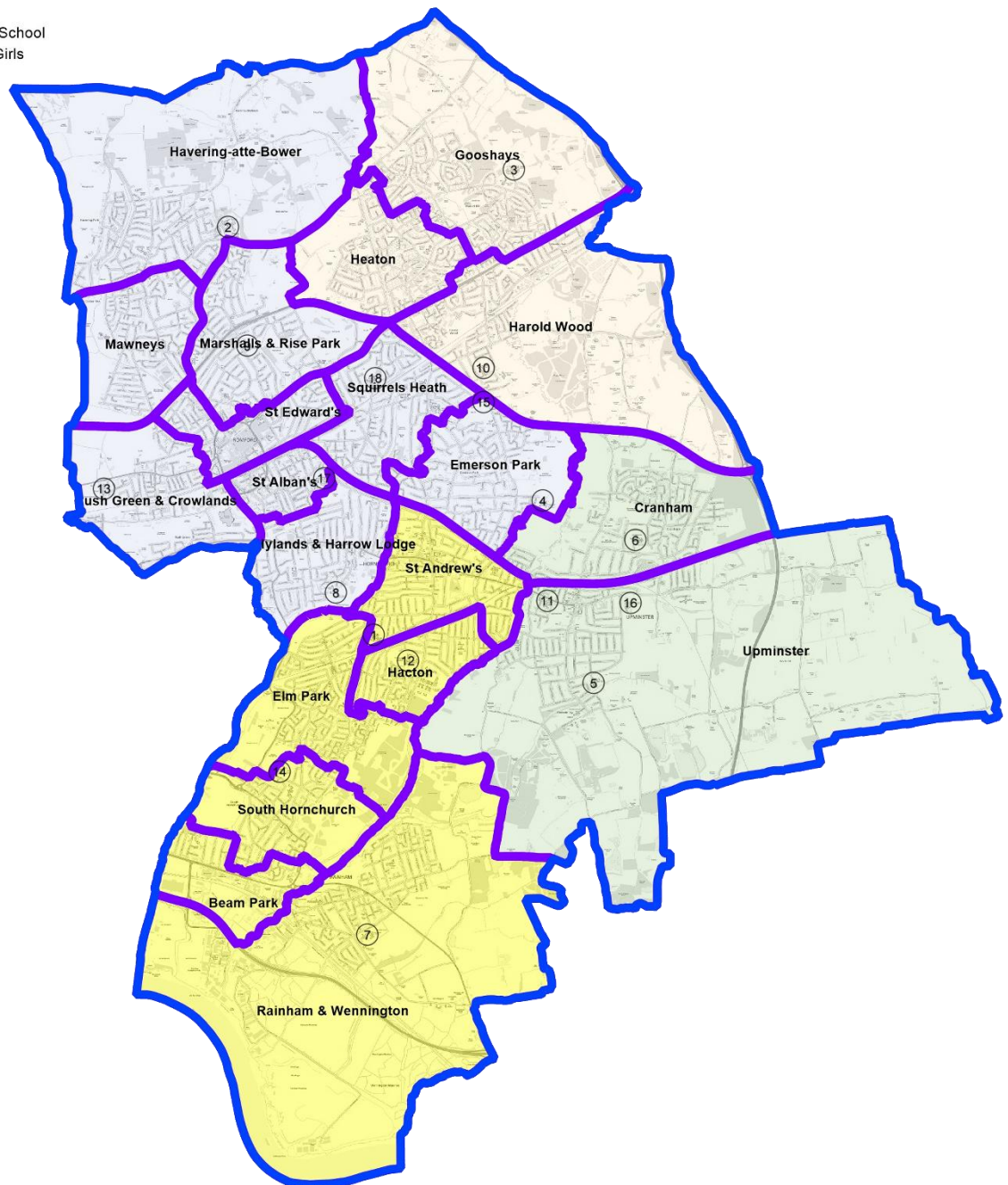
Secondary planning areas map

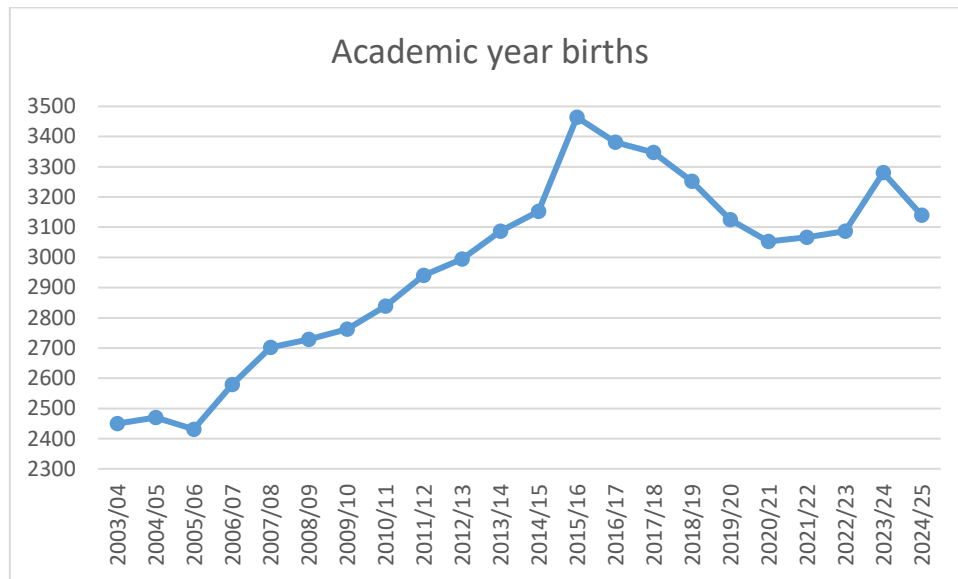

The following chart is Office for National Statistics (ONS) actual birth data for Havering by academic year:

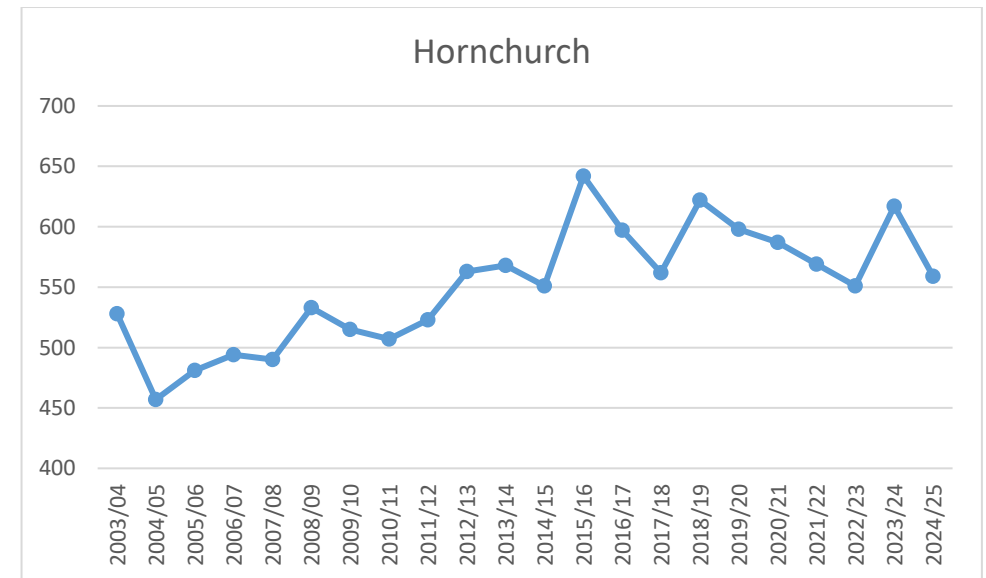
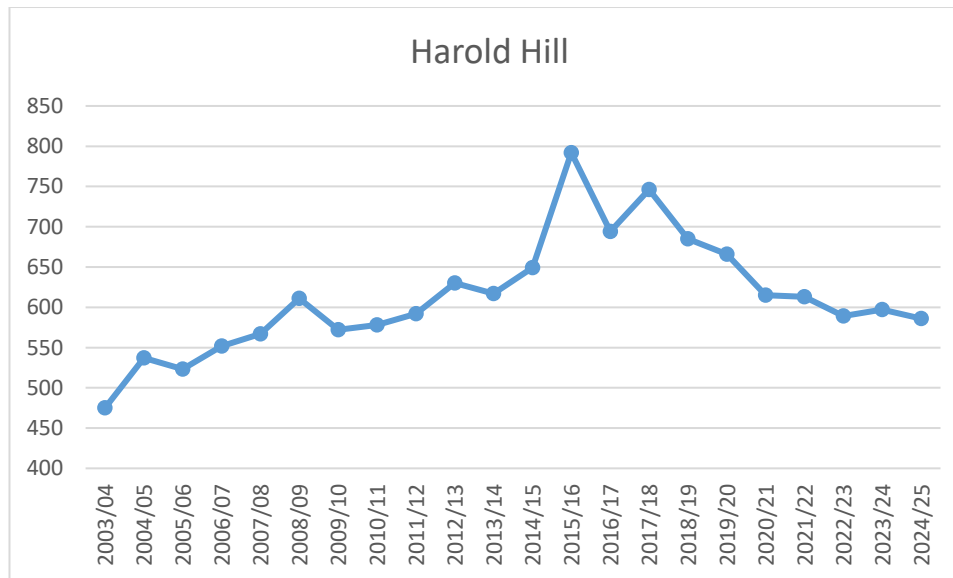
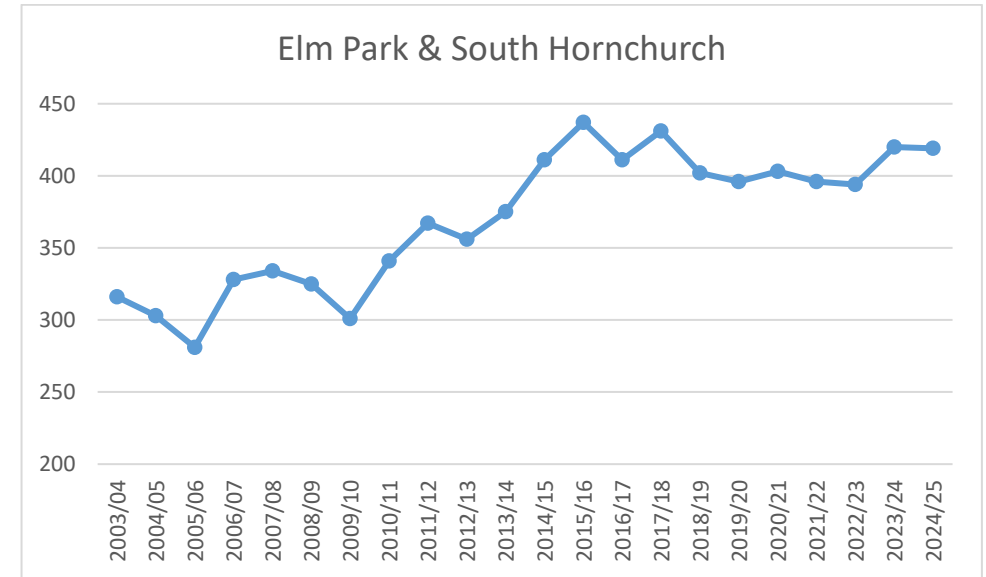
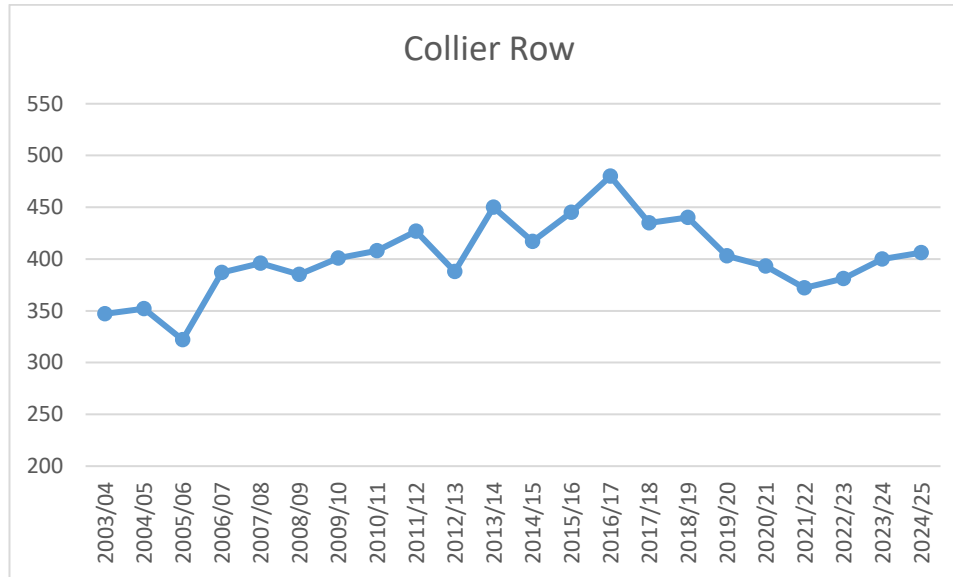


Havering saw a large increase in the birth rate from 2014/15 to 2015/16: the birth rate in 2014/15 was 3152 which increased to 3464 in 2015/16- an increase of 10% year on year.

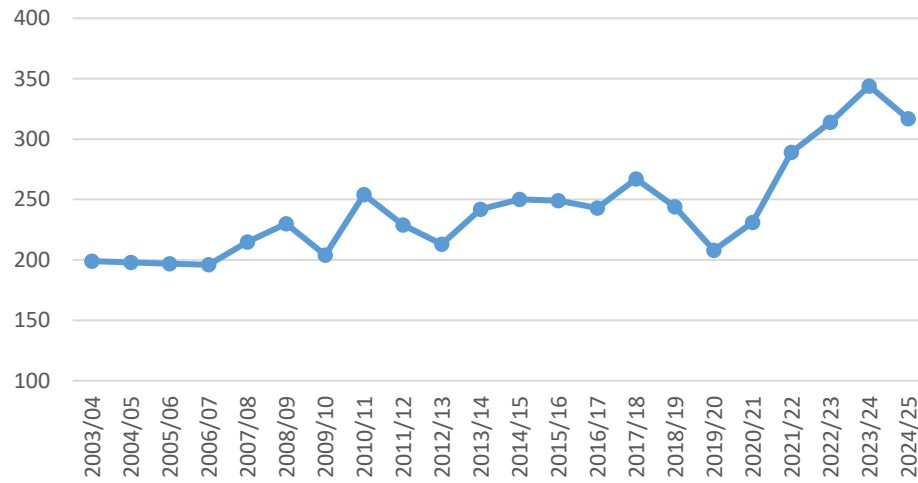
Between 2016/17 and 2020/21 the birth rate in Havering declined by 9.7%, and thereafter plateaued. The 2023/24 births increased by almost 200 on the previous year. Although the birth rate was then lower than the following year in 2024/25, this figure is still the second highest birth rate over the past six years.

The need for additional school places in Havering will largely be driven by new housing planned in the borough generating additional children who require a school place.

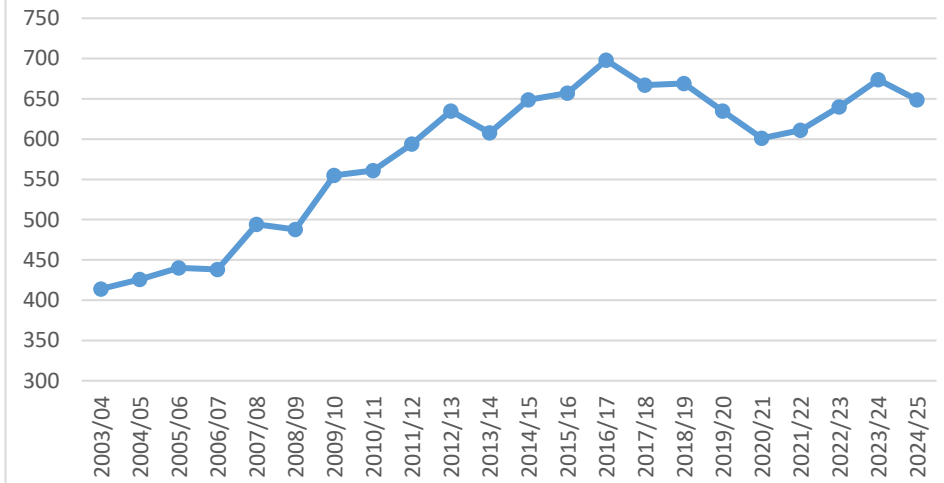
Actual births by primary planning areas



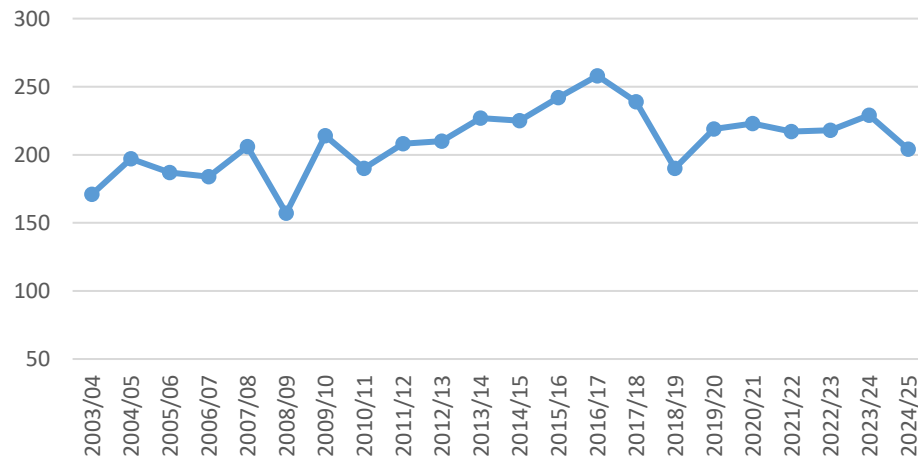

Section E –

School roll projection methodology

School Place Planning methodology

The following information is used to calculate school roll projections in Havering:

- Actual birth data received from the ONS
- Projected birth data published by the ONS
- Historic pupil data obtained from the school census
- Housing development data obtained from our planning department

The school roll projections for both primary and secondary are based on the January school census.

Year Reception and Primary

The authority calculates independently a projection of pupil numbers for each of the seven primary planning areas. The accuracy of the individual planning area projections is the starting point when updating the projections.

The main method used to project school rolls in Havering is the cohort survival method. The base information used in forecasting the number of children entering Reception in each primary planning area in Havering is the number of children in Reception classes in each planning area as a proportion of the births five years earlier (obtained from the school census for previous years). Using this method allows the planning area projections to follow local trends of the corresponding years planning area births in Havering.

The actual birth data is provided by the ONS at ward level. This birth data allows the historical uptake factor to be calculated between the number of births and the number of children entering at reception five years later. The past trend of reception intake to the birth rate for the corresponding year is calculated, an average established and then applied to the birth rate for future years to calculate the projected reception intake for each of the seven planning areas.

When actual live birth data is not available from the ONS, projected birth data from the ONS is used.

Once the number for Reception has been projected for each planning area, the past trend of cohort movement through the primary phase year on year from reception to year 6 is calculated, an average established and applied to each age cohort as they move through the system.

The projections for each planning area are added together to produce a primary projection for the whole of Havering. The method of projecting each primary planning area individually is to make sure that the primary projections produced for Havering are more sensitive to localised changes in the population, such as one-off dips in the birth rate within a particular planning area.

Year 7 and Secondary

The authority calculates independently a projection of pupil numbers for each of the four secondary planning areas. The accuracy of the individual planning area projections is the starting point when updating the projections.

To generate the secondary projections, historical data is used to calculate the transfer rate from the borough year 6 roll to year 7 roll the following year for each secondary planning area. The year 6 roll data allows the historical uptake factor to be calculated between the year 6 roll at borough level and the number of children entering a year 7 class in the corresponding secondary planning area the following year. This represents the number of children attending year 6 in a Havering primary school that will go on to attend a secondary school in the corresponding secondary planning area the following year.

Once the number for year 7 has been projected for each of the 4 secondary planning areas, the past trend of cohort movement through the secondary phase year on year from year 7 to year 11 is calculated, an average established and applied to each age cohort as they move through the secondary year groups.

The projections for each planning area are added together to produce a secondary projection for the whole of Havering. The method of projecting each secondary planning area individually as a proportion of the total year 6 roll is to make sure that the secondary projections produced for Havering reflect the popularity of different schools within the borough.

Post 16 Projections- Havering School Sixth Forms

Projections for Havering school sixth forms are made by using staying on rates calculated by comparing historic year 12 numbers with the year 11 numbers the previous year. Similarly, the historic trend of year 13 numbers compared to year 12 pupil numbers the previous year is calculated.

Once the past trend of cohort movement year on year from year 11 to year 12 and year 12 to year 13 has been calculated, an average is established and applied to the year 11 projection to provide Havering school sixth form projections for future years. School sixth form projections are produced at planning area level before being aggregated to produce a borough total.

Housing

It is expected that planned housing will help maintain the need for school places in Havering. The current London Plan has the ten year housing target for Havering as 12,850 new homes over the period 2019/20 - 2028/29.

Havering has two GLA housing zones- Romford and Rainham and Beam Park. The Romford housing zone is due to deliver over 3,300 new homes and the Rainham and Beam Park housing zone is due to deliver over 3,450 new homes.

The projected child yield expected from the new housing forms part of the Local Plan has been factored in the school roll projections. The trajectory has had some

adjustments made by planning colleagues to reflect the fact that completion of some developments has been delayed.

It is important to note that new housing will be a key driver in future school roll forecasts, any changes to the housing trajectory either to the housing numbers or when the housing will be delivered, will likely lead to changes to the future projected demand for school places.

The child yield from each housing scheme is phased over a five or three-year period to reflect the fact that housing developments are not all occupied immediately, nor generate child yield immediately. For the primary phase the child yield is phased over a three-year period, with 40% added the first year, followed by 30% and 30% the following years. For the secondary phase the child yield is phased evenly over a five-year period, with 20% added each year.

The child yield is aggregated from ward level to planning area level and then split out by year group. In primary the child yield is split out by weighting the yield at 20% each in reception, year 1 and year 2, with 10% each across years 3-6. The effect of splitting out the child yield this way instead of evenly splitting across all year groups (as with secondary) is subtle, but weights the child yield slightly in the earlier year groups, thus ensuring that additional capacity required to meet the demand arising from new housing is implemented in time.

Currently an average of 0.268 is used as the child yield multiplier for Primary, 0.131 for Secondary and an average of 0.046 used as the child yield for post-16. These have been calculated by assessing the average child yield produced by 1/2/3/4 bed units. These yields are based on the DfE Pupil Yield Dashboard.

Child yield from housing developments is factored into the primary, secondary and Havering school sixth form projections

Cross Border Movement

Our main method of projection is cohort survival rates which are reviewed each year. They are used to determine whether changes are occurring in pupil flows and methodology for borough, planning area level and school level projections, with the projections adapted accordingly. Parental preferences for schools are used when projecting numbers at school level.

We maintain a close relationship with our neighbouring boroughs in order to monitor issues that may impact cross border movement of students. We liaise regularly with our neighbouring Local Authorities, thus providing ample opportunity to update each other regarding what's happening on the ground as well as sharing expertise and best practice.

Our projections are reviewed on an annual basis and adjustments are made to reflect the most recent trends regarding school attendance.

Accuracy of Forecasts

We produce reports looking at the variance between the school census actual numbers on roll and the projections. Any planning areas/year groups with high variance are investigated and changes are applied where appropriate before updating the projections each year.

As previously noted we also maintain a close relationship with our neighbouring boroughs in order to monitor issues that may impact cross border movement of students. Our projections are reviewed on an annual basis and adjustments are made to reflect the most recent trends regarding school attendance.

The accuracy of previous projections is reviewed as a starting point for the production of a new series of projections. In this way inconsistencies or problems with the previous projections can be identified and corrected before the new set of projections is produced.

Significant planned school organisation changes have been taken into consideration in working out projections.

Cohort survival rates are reviewed each year. They are used to determine whether changes are occurring in pupil flows and methodology for planning area level and school-level projections, with the projections adapted accordingly.

We consult schools regarding the individual school roll projections for their school and a projection for the planning area they are in. All the adjustments raised by schools on their individual projections will be considered and revised in the projections where appropriate.
