TEMPORARY STOP NOTICE

1. On **25th April 2024**, the Council has issued this Temporary Stop Notice alleging that there has been a breach of planning control on the land described in paragraph 4 below.

2. This temporary stop notice is issued by the Council, in exercise of their power in section 171E of the 1990 Act, because they think that it is expedient that the activity specified in this notice should cease on the land described in section 3 below. The Council now prohibits the carrying out of the activity specified in this notice. Important additional information is given in the Annex to this notice.

3. THE REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

The Council considers that there has been a breach of planning control on the land described in paragraph 4 below.

The activities taking place have harmed the character of the area and the it is necessary to cease operations to prevent further harm being caused.

4. THE LAND TO WHICH THIS NOTICE RELATES

Land adjacent to 1 Bramble Cottages, Bramble Lane, RM14 2XL

5. THE ACTIVITY TO WHICH THIS NOTICE RELATES

1. Without planning permission, the carrying out of activities in association with all engineering operations at land at Land adjacent to 1 Bramble Cottages, Bramble Lane.

2. Without planning permission, the importation of waste materials onto the land.

6. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

1) To cease all engineering operations at land at Land adjacent to 1 Bramble Cottages, Bramble Lane.

2) Cease the importation of materials onto the land

3) Cease bringing any containers, plant, machinery and equipment onto the land.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This notice takes effect on **25th APRIL 2024** when all the activity specified in this notice shall cease. This notice will cease to have effect on **20th JUNE 2024**.

THERE IS NO RIGHT OF APPEAL TO THE FIRST SECRETARY OF STATE AGAINST THIS NOTICE.


It is an offence to contravene a temporary stop notice after a site notice has been displayed or the temporary stop notice has been served on you (Section 171G of the 1990 Act). If you then fail to comply with the temporary stop notice you will be at risk of **immediate prosecution** in the Magistrates' Court, for which the maximum penalty is unlimited on summary conviction for a first offence and for any subsequent offence. The fine on conviction on indictment is unlimited.

If you need independent advice about this notice, you are advised to contact urgently a lawyer, planning consultant or other professional adviser specialising in planning matters. If you wish to contest the validity of the notice, you may only do so by an application to the High Court for judicial review.

S.171G. Temporary stop notice: offences

- (1) A person commits an offence if he contravenes a temporary stop notice—
 - (a) which has been served on him, or
 - (b) a copy of which has been displayed in accordance with section 171E(5).
- (2) Contravention of a temporary stop notice includes causing or permitting the contravention of the notice.
- (3) An offence under this section may be charged by reference to a day or a longer period.
- (4) A person may be convicted of more than one such offence in relation to the same temporary stop notice by reference to different days or periods of time.
- (5) A person does not commit an offence under this section if he proves—
 - (a) that the temporary stop notice was not served on him, and
 - (b) that he did not know, and could not reasonably have been expected to know, of its existence.
- (6) A person convicted of an offence under this section is liable—
 - (a) on summary conviction, to an unlimited fine;
 - (b) on conviction on indictment, to a fine.
- (7) In determining the amount of the fine, the court must have regard in particular to any financial benefit, which has accrued or has appeared to accrue to the person convicted in consequence of the offence.
