

# STATUTORY PROPOSAL FOR THE DISCONTINUANCE OF SQUIRRELS HEATH INFANT SCHOOL

#### **Reason for Closure**

A statement explaining the reason why closure of the school is considered necessary.

The Local Authority has brought forward the proposal as they consider that an amalgamation of Squirrels Heath Infant and Junior Schools will be in the best educational interest of current and future pupils.

A 4 Week period of public consultation, including meetings with staff, governors, and parents, along with other interested parties was undertaken from 24/02/2025 to 24/03/2025.

The views of responses received during the consultation period is as detailed in the consultation feedback report; appendix B of the executive decision for the publication of statutory notice which can be viewed via this <u>link</u>.



## Pupil numbers and admissions

The numbers (distinguishing between compulsory and non-compulsory school age pupils), age range, sex, and special educational needs of pupils (distinguishing between boarding and day pupils) for whom provision is currently made at the school.

Squirrels Heath Infant School is a co-education infant school for pupils aged 4 to 7. The school has a published Admissions Number (PAN) of 90 for each year group, giving a total of 270 places. As at January 2025, the school had 257pupils on roll.

The school does not have any boarding provision or provide educational provision recognised by the local authority as being reserved for children with special educational needs. There are 18 pupils on roll who have been identified as having special educational needs (SEN support) and 17 pupils with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP).

## Displaced pupils

#### No pupils will be displaced

All pupils attending Squirrels Heath Infant School at the time of its closure will automatically transfer onto the roll of the enlarged Primary School

There will be no impact on the community through the closure of Squirrels Heath Infant School as the new Primary School will serve the same community and will use the same site
